GENERAL APPROACH BY EXAMINER

QUESTION 1

(30 Marks)

Using the principles of life cycle management of assets, discuss the process of planning and provision of railway infrastructure and rolling stock for a freight or passenger railway. Elaborate on the implications of the relative indivisibility and longevity of these assets from a business perspective.

QUESTION 2 (30 Marks)

Discuss the role of information technology to improve the performance of a railway system from an internal as well as an external service perspective. In the light of SADC Protocols, discuss the importance of technical regional cooperation from an information perspective.

QUESTION 3 (30 Marks)

In what ways can an investment in modern technology help to improve the performance of railway equipment including availability and utilization of locomotives, freight wagons and passenger coaches?

QUESTION 4 (30 Marks)

Discuss how British Rail set about privatizing The British Railway System and indicate specifically how they dealt with the operating as well the infrastructural challenges.

QUESTION 5 (30 Marks)

How would you advise the Department of Transport in South Africa to use the national railway system as a fulcrum to stimulate tourism and how could the Department of Public Enterprises in South Africa to use the national railway system as a fulcrum to stimulate rural development?

QUESTION 6 (30 Marks)

How would a diverse technology base impact on the management of a railway network? In the light of your views, discuss the pros and cons of **electrifying** a railway network versus deploying diesel-powered locomotives.
