

QUESTION 3

Answer any one of the following questions. In your answer book, clearly indicate the number and letter of the question you are answering.

a) What are the characteristics of a developmental state? Using these characteristics, explain how South Africa is and is not a developmental state (or does or does not have the potential to become one)? [25]

b) What is civil society and how is it comprised (types of organisation)? What are the various roles that civil society plays in governance and development? Use examples where possible. [25]

QUESTION 4

Answer any <u>one</u> of the following questions. In your answer book, clearly indicate the number and letter of the question you are answering.

a) It is well recognised that donor aid plays an important role in supporting development programmes. What are the different types of development aid donors? What role do donors play in governance? How do they exert their influence? [25]

OR

b) How powerful is the corporate sector in governance and development? Explain the different ways – positive and negative – in which the corporate sector exerts its influence on government.

c) What are the roles of the World Trade Organisation (WTO) and the G20? What are the reasons for protest against the WTO in Seattle and all subsequent WTO and G20 meetings? Argue what you think the impact of the WTO is on development in developing countries. [25]
