SECTION A: (Prof Viviers)

QUESTION 1:

Write a short essay where you deliberate on the differences between science and religion

Write a short essay in which you question the scientific discourse on being thoroughly "objective" as well as its presumed status of being "omniscient". For the latter you can utilize Vorster's arguments on the origins of early Christianity.

QUESTION 3:

Elaborate, in a paragraph, that god(s) is a social construct that underwent changes throughout history, as has been shown by Armstrong. [5]

QUESTION 4:

In what important aspect does Krüger differ from Gregersen and Van Huyssteen in presenting their narratives? Whose view do you find most convincing? [5]

QUESTION 5:

Discuss and compare, in a short essay, both Jewish scholars of science, Aviezer and Schroeder, and their efforts to "harmonize" Genesis 1 and the Big Bang. [10]

Highlight the religion and science debate in contemporary Islamic thought under the following heading and refer in your answer to prominent representatives:

a) Islamization (or "prove the chemical composition of milk in relation to certain verses of the Qur'ān") [5]
