QUESTION 1 Kounin's (1997:80) Model for good classroom behaviour

Kounin (1977: 80) believes that learners' good classroom behaviour depends on the type of teaching instruction demonstrated by the teacher. His theoretical model for good classroom behaviour is based on five points/areas namely: withitness, overlapping, momentum, smoothness and group focus in teaching instruction. Kounin's also emphasises that teachers must be well prepared and organised and, also communicate their instruction effectively to the learners.

- 1.1 Critically evaluate the five points/areas in the context of teaching in a diverse environment in the South African context. (10)
- 1.2 How would you use Kounin's five points of classroom behaviour management to strengthen your teaching practice? (10)

QUESTION 2 Classroom Discipline

Rogers (1998:11) defines discipline as a "teacher directed activity that seeks to lead, guide, direct, manage or confront a learner about behaviour that disrupts the rights of other learners". Rogers also distinguishes between three types of discipline.

- 2.1 Explain the three different types of discipline that Rogers (1998) refers to and give an example of its use in your teaching practice. (10)
- 2.2 Give an account of how you would create a safe and disciplined teaching and learning environment for your learners. (10)

QUESTION 3 Classroom Management

As a teacher of 40 learners in a multi-cultural, diverse classroom and school environment:

- 3.1 What strategies and techniques would you utilise for maximum learner participation? (10)
