**Question 1:**

A National Economic Development and Labour Council (NEDLAC) task team is currently discussing the implementation of some form of a national minimum wage agreement for South Africa. Currently there is a series of hearings and workshops held on the possibility of implementing such a national minimum wage. Critically discuss the following regarding minimum wages:

- a) The theoretical debate around the effects of minimum wages (Keynesian, neo-classical and post-Keynesian schools)
- b) Minimum wage determination in South Africa and evidence of the impact of minimum wage legislation in the retail, domestic worker, taxi, forestry and security sectors,

- c) Arguments **in favour** and **against** the implementation of a national minimum wage for South Africa
