 - c) He borrowed R2400 from his uncle to buy his bicycle. Sipho will pay back his uncle R100 per month over two years and will only start paying back this debt in 12 months' time.

 - 4.2.2 What is the total amount of his liabilities? (1)
 - 4.2.3 Classify liabilities in item 4.2 a c above by advising whether the liability is a current liability or long term liability.(4)
 - 4.2.4 What is Sipho's net worth? Show the calculations. (3)
 - 4.2.5 Comment on Sipho's net worth, based on affordability. (1)
