QUESTION 4

Mrs Smith has a full-time job working as a nanny. Her wages are R750 per week plus R20 per hour when she works overtime. Mr Smith works part-time at a factory in Mossel Bay three days a week. He earns R250 per shift. Patrick Smith, their son, does deliveries for the local shop on his bike. He works on Monday and Wednesday afternoons and Saturday mornings. He is paid R20 per shift plus tips. On average, he receives R25 in tips per week. Grace, the Smith's daughter, also works at the local spaza shop in her spare time. She usually works on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons and on Saturday mornings. She gets paid R30 per shift. The Smith's monthly expenses are: Rent R2500, Transport R400, Clothes R900, Groceries R2000, Electricity R500, Caring for grandparents R1000. Mrs Smith likes to treat the family to fast foods from Chicken Licken or KFC weekly and makes sure that the family always wear the latest fashions by buying clothing regularly from Edgars, Truworths and Markhams. Mrs Smith currently owes all these clothing stores varying amounts of money.

(Please note that when doing your calculations in Question 4, a month usually has four weeks, however there are some months that have five weeks).

- 4.1 Make a list of the fixed personal income earned by each member of the Smith family and calculate the Smith's total fixed income.

 - 4.2.2 From the information given above, what will Patrick's income be if he is paid tips each week in a five-week month? (1)
 - 4.2.3 Calculate total variable income for the Smith family. (5)
- What are the Smith's total expenses? Explain in two sentences and how the fixed and variable income earned by the Smith family influences their monthly budget? (3)
- 4.4 Explain in five sentences what advice you could give the Smith family on cutting down on their expenses (based on your calculations and the information provided in the case study).

QUESTION 5

Cecilia Mojela wants to start her own transport business. Two years ago, she bought a minibus and got her driver's licence. She moved to an area where there are many people who need transport to school and to the bus and train stations. Cecilia now has enough money to buy another minibus and employ another driver. In order to do so, Cecilia wants to employ someone who understands the transport business and/or has the relevant skills set to enable her to grow her business further. But, she is unsure about how to identify and hire such a person. Celia is also concerned about the increasing petrol prices and how to insure her vehicle and she is uncertain about how to work out what to charge her customers. The people in the community complain that the few taxis around are very expensive. Her nephew is studying Economic Management Science and he is willing to help out.

- 5.1 Critically analyse Cecilia's business by providing a SWOT analysis. Use any three aspects from the information provided above and list the relevant aspects under the SWOT analysis. Then advise which are internal factors and external factors and why you have classified them in this way. (15)
