Question 1: (obligatory)

Ouestion 2:

According to Hennie Viviers, both science and theology are mediated (done) through cultural eyes. Elaborate (20)

Question 3:

Critically discuss the pre-modern Muslim scholar al-Ghazali's categorization of the sciences. Show how he differs from many modern Muslim scholars on science (20)

Ouestion 4:

Juxtapose Aviezer and Schroeder's on Genesis' account of the beginning of the world. Show key differences between them. Mention Matt Plen's critique of both (20)

Section B: Religion and Environmental Justice (Prof Viviers)

Answer all questions.

Question 1:

Write a short essay on Habel's emphasis on Eaton and other ecofeminists "...standing with the oppressed Earth". Link this with the 3 steps of a green reading of texts to illustrate how this identifying with Earth is achieved. (15)

Question 2:

Highlight Olupona's views on ecological awareness in African Religion under the following headings:

- a) The relationship of ritual and nature in African Religion (6)
- b) The role that water plays in the language, myths, and rituals of African traditional religion (9)

Question 3:

Discuss the traditional belief systems and *chimurenga* motives in ecology as found in Zimbabwe (Daneel) (20)
