QUESTION 1

Unit Manager Rose is in Charge of a Casualty Department in a private hospital. She receives a phone call from an ambulance attendant informing her that he is bringing a non-medical aid homeless patient who was involved in a hit and run motor vehicle accident. Sr Rose tells the ambulance attendant not to bring the patient to her hospital as they only admit medical aid patients. Sr Jacolas who is with Sr Rose at the time agrees with the decision saying that they are busy as is and this non-paying patient should go to the neighbouring state hospital.

Soon after that, the Nurse Manager on duty storms into casualty, reprimands Sr Rose in front of patients, telling her that there has been a report about the patient who was turned away and that she will be disciplined about that decision. Sr Rose was wearing a track suit which was not in line with the hospital uniform and no distinguishing devices. She was told to go home and put on her proper uniform, distinguishing devices and name badge and thereafter go and assist in theatre with Termination of Pregnancies (TOPs) as theatre is very busy and short staffed. Sr Rose refuses to go to theatre for several reasons.
