QUESTION 1

QUESTION 2

(30 MARKS)

Recommend measures that you think the city should incorporate to reduce private car travel.

QUESTION 3

(40 MARKS)

The eToll project in the Gauteng Province is an example of a project which was not successful because of the lack of support from the public. The government has hired you as a consultant to ensure that this does not happen in future transport projects. You will need to firstly motivate to them why the public participation process is so important. Secondly, you will need to explain to them basic principles/ good practices that they should incorporate in their public participation processes. Government is planning an expansion of the Gautrain project. Recommend the types of public participation approaches they can apply at various stages of the project.

QUESTION 4

(40 MARKS)

The CITP planning process is said to be an integrated systems approach. Evaluate this statement by comparing the systems approach to the CITP planning approach.
