- b. Explain what is meant by the term "citizenship" in urban contexts, and how urban infrastructure is means through which citizenship (or its lack) is experienced and produced. (5)
- c. Explain the disagreement between Nuttall and Mbembe (2004) and Watts (2005), and its implications for how we approach the study of African cities. (5)
- d. Drawing on Low (2000), explain the difference between the "social production of space" and the "social construction of space", providing examples of each. (5)
