- d. Why does Wirth argue that "urbanism is a way of life" and what does he mean by urbanization? (5)

QUESTION 2:

- a. Many studies of African cities focus on slums, but their representation within scholarly work as well as popular culture remains controversial. Drawing from the readings and lectures of the class, explain the critiques of writings about slums, and discuss how these critiques are linked to the broader question of the politics of representation. (35)
- Explain the characteristics of citizenship and its significance to urbanism. Then, drawing from readings about urban planning and infrastructure, explain how infrastructure has been a means of both exclusion and claim-making in contemporary urban spaces. (35)
