### **QUESTION 1 - Tourism, Sustainability and the Environment**

- 1.1 Discuss the relationship between tourism and the environment. Include relevant examples to substantiate your discussion. (9)
- 1.2 The environment is a "playground where tourism performs." Explain what that means in the context of the environment. In your discussion, indicate whether tourism does more harm than good to the environment, and provide examples to support your argument. (8)
- 1.3 Tourism is a significant contributor to climate change. Briefly introduce the concept of climate change {3} and discuss, with the help of examples, how tourism has contributed to climate change {5}. (8)
- 1.4 For sustainable tourism development to be achieved, two (2) elements must be looked at. Provide a discourse on the two elements, and use practical African examples to substantiate your discussion. (10)

### **QUESTION 2 - Ecotourism**

- 2.1 Discuss in detail the four principles of ecotourism. While highlighting the key elements in each principle, provide recommendations on how each of them can be achieved when developing ecotourism. (15)
- 2.2 Ecotourism, in a nutshell, is tourism that has great emphasis on the community. Evaluate the different roles that the community has to play to ensure that ecotourism fulfils its purpose. (10)
- 2.3 If ecotourism is planned and implemented well, the community will reap both tangible and intangible benefits. Explain this further through giving a distinction between tangible and intangible benefits, with an aid of examples {4}. In addition, discuss the benefits of ecotourism in a typical African setting {6}. (10)

### **QUESTION 3 - Sports Tourism**

The phenomenon of sport tourism has grown increasingly over the last decade as a tourism niche in both develop and developing contexts. Discuss the main contributing factors that have led to such growth. (35)

### **QUESTION 4 - Youth Tourism and Sustainability**

The youth tourism market has a very crucial role to play in the sustainability of the global, regional and national tourism sector. Discuss how youth tourists are set to be potential contributors to the sustainability of the ever growing tourism sector with relation to the following facets:

- The economic potential of the youth tourist market
- How youth tourists can be instrumental in the growth of the South African domestic tourism sector. (35)
