QUESTION 1

Read the following extract which appeared in NEWS 24 on the 27 September 2016.

Chief Khoisan Africa highlighted the importance of Khoisan culture and was on a lone mission to push for the recognition of the Khoisan language.

Draped in animal skin, the 47-year-old resident of Bloemendal clasped in one hand a traditional walking stick while the other carried a bag filled with bows and arrows.

"I would like to appeal to the government, including the ordinary citizens, that Khoisan people are the original owners of South Africa. The Khoisan people have a language called Khoekhoe," he said of his mission.

With reference to the above extract, provide a critical discussion on the recognition of the Khoisan language as one of South Africa's official languages. Your discussion should include an evaluation of the San, Khoikhoi and early farmer's settlement in Southern Africa, their history and changes experienced over time.
