Question 1

'Profound digitalization of public administration is gaining momentum and spatial planning is no exception. Despite the obvious potential of such data to inform planning practice and associated outcomes, in the developing world municipal authorities these new data platforms are few, as most mainly focus on technical or judicial aspects of planning. Hence questions related to how planning practice can be digitised whilst ensuring efficiency, evaluation and design need to be addressed.'

In light of the above statement, reflect on the salience of the smart cities concept in this age of the 4th Industrial Revolution in Africa.
