The General Manager has hired Thomas as the new Executive Housekeeping Manager. The hotel has 255 rooms. Of which some rooms are suites, family rooms, luxury rooms and standard rooms.

3.1 Calculate the number of RA's required for the morning shift during the month of May, using the below information:

Expected occupancy: 55%

Cleaning duties: General cleaning – 5 minutes; bed making - 8 minutes; bathroom cleaning - 4 minutes; wiping & dusting - 2 minutes; vacuuming – 5 minutes; travel time - 3 minutes.

Each will require only 1 RA to clean.

A shift is 9 hours with 1 hour break.
