Iliad (Book 1)

Leaving his friends in haste, Akhilleus wept,	1
and sat apart by the grey wave, scanning the endless sea.	
Often he spread his hands in prayer to his mother:	2 3
"As my life came from you, though it is brief,	4
honour at least from Zeus who storms in heaven	5
I call my due. He gives me precious little.	6
See how the lord of the great plains, Agamémnon,	7
humiliated me! He has my prize,	8
by his own whim, for himself."	9
Eyes wet with tears	10
he spoke, and her ladyship his mother heard him	11
in green deeps where she lolled near her old father.	12
Gliding she rose and broke like mist from the inshore	13
grey sea face, to sit down softly before him,	14
her son in tears: and fondling him she said:	15
"Child, why do you weep? What grief is this?	16
Out with it, tell me, both of us should know."	17
Akhilleus, fast in battle as a lion,	18
groaned and said:	19
"Why tell you what you know?	20
We sailed out raiding, and we took by storm	21
that ancient town of Eëtíôn called Thêbê,	22
plundered the place, brought slaves and spoils away.	23
At the division, later,	24
they chose a young girl, Khrysêis, for the king.	25
Then Khrysês, priest of the Archer god, Apollo,	26
came to the beachhead we Akhaians hold,	27
bringing no end of ransom for his daughter;	28
he had the god's white bands on a golden staff	29
and sued for grace from the army of Akhaia,	30
mostly the two Atreidai, corps commanders.	31
All of our soldiers murmured in assent:	32
'Behave well to the priest. And take the ransom!'	33

But Agamemnon would not. It went against his desire,	34
and brutally he ordered the man away.	35
So the old man withdrew in grief and anger.	36
Apollo cared for him: he heard his prayer	37
and let black bolts of plague fly on the Argives.	38

Dawn reluctantly	1
Left Tithonus in her rose-shadowed bed,	
Then shook the morning into flakes of fire.	3
Light flooded the halls of Olympus	4
Where Zeus, high Lord of Thunder,	5
Sat with the other gods, listening to Athena	6
Reel off the tale of Odysseus' woes	7
It galled her that he was still in Calypso's cave:	8
"Zeus, my father – and all you blessed immortals –	9
Kings might as well no longer be gentle and kind	10
Or understand the correct order of things.	11
They might as well be tyrannical butchers	12
For all that any of Odysseus' people	13
Remember him, a godly king as kind as a father.	14
No, he's still languishing on that island, detained	15
Against his will by that nymph Calypso,	16
No way in the world for him to get back to his land.	17
His ships are all lost, he has no crew left	18
To row him across the sea's crawling back.	19
And now the islanders are plotting to kill his son	20

As he heads back home. He went for news of his father	21
To sandy Pylos and white-bricked Sparta."	22
Storm Cloud Zeus had an answer for her:	23
"Quite a little speech you've let slip through your teeth,	24
Daughter. But wasn't this exactly your plan	25
So that Odysseus would make them pay for it later?	26

Back to Ithaca and out of harm's way	28
