## Read the following and answer the questions that follow.

You are probably familiar with the saying: "Tell me and I forget, show me and I remember, involve me and I understand." - Confucius, 450 B.C. The last part of this statement by Confucius is the essence of heuristic teaching-learning.

One of the basic and common messages from research on how young learners learn science is that, for young learners to understand science concepts, often requires that they wrestle with how and why the real meaning of those concepts are more satisfactory and logical explanations than their own current beliefs. This means that, for effective and meaningful learning, they should be actively involved in teaching-learning situations. Learning science effectively, therefore, requires direct involvement with real-life objects, concepts, processes or situations and much guidance to learners in how to interpret observations.

To become a heuristic educator we need to make the mind shift from 'I need to teach my learners this content' to 'my role is to help learners learn this content'.
