- b) Explain how you will select the participants from UJ, Wits and UNISA. Explain the advantages and disadvantages of the chosen sampling method and how you will overcome these challenges. [6]
- c) Explain the type of data collection and analysis method you will use and why? [5]
- d) Explain how you will ensure this study fulfils all the ethical requirements of a sociological sound research project. Discuss by giving examples. [7]

QUESTION 2: [TOTAL 25 MARKS]

There has been a recent trend in violent crimes at petrol stations in South Africa. You have been asked to conduct a quantitative research project on petrol attendants and their perceptions of safety at work. You are required to include at least 60 petrol attendants who are employed at three petrol stations in Johannesburg. The study aims to explore whether petrol attendants feel safe at their workplace and what crime prevention tools have been implemented at petrol stations. In your research, you need to include the following:

- a) Explain why a quantitative methodological approach is appropriate for this study. [7]
- b) Explain how you will select the petrol attendants from three petrol stations. Also explain the advantages and disadvantages of the chosen sampling method, and how you will overcome these challenges. [6]
- c) Explain the advantages and disadvantages of using survey questionnaires to collect data [5]
- d) Explain some of the ethical considerations you will implement when conducting this research. Use examples. [7]

QUESTION 1: [TOTAL 25 MARKS]

Discuss the Fourth Industrial Revolution noting its key elements and its implications for work organization and labour. Using examples and with reference to the literature, critically evaluate its pros and cons.

QUESTION 2: [TOTAL 25]

Discuss gender and gender-based oppression and exploitation at the workplace noting the different forms this can take. Use examples to explore and critically assess the usefulness of the theory of intersectionality in the struggle against patriarchy.

QUESTION 3: [TOTAL 25 MARKS]

Discuss the social and political factors that shaped the history of the South African trade union movement from its emergence in the 1973 Durban strike wave to its crossroads in the Marikana massacre. Evaluate the debates about the intersection of race and class, nationalism and socialism, in this historical development noting lessons for the future of the labour movement.

QUESTION 4: [TOTAL 25 MARKS]

Discuss the extent to which the 'mineral-energy complex' has shaped the use of labour and energy resources in South Africa and the implications for the environment and human well-being. Use examples to explore how trade unionists and climate justice activists have used the concept of a 'just transition' in the call to change from fossil fuels to renewable energy sources.
