Question:

Write a short argumentative essay (min 750, max 1000 words) in which you:

1. extract the author's central argument against vegetarianism and put it into standard premise form, using your own words.

2. Critically evaluate this argument by explaining whether it is valid/invalid and

sound/unsound. You need to give a detailed justification for your answer. If you

think the argument is valid, explain what (deductive) validity is, how to test for it,

and why this argument satisfies the requirement for validity. If you think it is not

valid, explain why you feel this argument fails the test for validity.

3. Justify your answer in terms of soundness. Go through each premise and justify

how it contributes to your verdict of sound or unsound.

In the article, the author considers potential responses to his argument. You may draw

on these in your own essay, but you have to relate them to the tests for validity and

soundness you mastered in term 1. You may also consult sources outside of the article

to support your critical evaluation.
