Question 3 (25 marks):

Are South Africans 'freer' in terms of civil liberties or with regard to socioeconomic equalities? Assess, using quality of democracy practices.

Question 1

"Women suffered a double colonization"

Discuss the statement above and compare it with arguments brought forward by some feminist scholars to illustrate how colonization benefited African women, as expressed by Oyeronke Oyewumi. (25)

Question 2

What caused the shift from 'reconciliation' to 'redistribution' in South Africa after 1994? Should retribution in South Africa be based on race or class according to Neville Alexandra? Discuss using examples. (25)

Question 3

Name and explain, five "theses" put forward to describe xenophobia according to David Matsinhe. Is South Africa experiencing xenophobia or 'afrophobia'? Use examples. (25)
